

PROJECT ELLA One of our ECO areas of focus this year is Marine Life. Both P6 classes have had an amazing opportunity to be involved in a conservation project. HPS successfully applied to be part of 'Project Ella' a scheme supported

by the Ards & North Down Council. Environmental Officers have met with each class to deliver interactive very informative. workshops. The children learnt PROJECT ELLA about biological life cycles and •



why conservation of many species is so important. As part of the Project Ella small fridges and a quantity of young sea trout are safely kept in each classroom. This is monitored by the experienced Environmental Officers throughout the project.

When the fish develop to a certain size, our pupils will help to release them into a suitable local stream or river. The

children are loving the opportunity to be part of the project and feel they are contributing positively to the environment.

We are asking for some PARENT VOLUNTEERS to help with gardening in the school grounds later this term. Mrs Mc Keown will email parents with more details. THANK YOU in anticipation of your support.

SAFE USE OF THE INTERNET

The use of parental controls on devices can help to filter material accessed by your child ensuring it is age appropriate. By regularly talking to your child, having an awareness of what they are viewing or listening to, as well as knowing who they are communicating with, can help protect them from many risks.
