




P4 & P5 Christmas Concert

Christmas Cards 2023

Each year we operate a Christmas Post Box Delivery Service. Children and members of staff buy charity stamps and post Christmas cards in the school post box in the Piccadilly area. There is much excitement when our P7 pupils deliver the cards to classes. Stamps

can be bought from teachers from Monday 4 December until Tuesday 12 December. It's £1 for 36 stamps or 50p for 18 stamps.

The children bring their cards into school on a SET DAY. We have chosen WEDNESDAY 13 Cedar **DECEMBER.** They will post their cards into the school Christmas postbox. The cards will then be distributed to classes the following week.


P6 Residential Trip
